



OFFICIAL MS. MARVELOUS PAGEANT RULES

- The contestant must have lived in Knox County, Indiana for at least three months prior to the pageant date or be a participant in KCARC programs.
- Any female meeting the definition of disability under the government laws acts defining disability (Disability Discrimination Act 1195: "A person has a disability for the purpose of this Act if (s)he has a physical or mental impairment which has a substantial and long-term adverse effect on his (her) ability to carry out normal day-to-day activities.") is eligible to compete in the Ms. Marvelous Pageant.
- Documentation of disability must be provided upon request.
- Each contestant must be a U.S. citizen and must be of good moral character; never have been convicted of a crime; have no criminal charges pending against them, or have any adjudication pending against them.
- The Ms. Marvelous Pageant will allow any female to compete for no matter if married, single, divorced, widowed or separated.
- Each contestant is required to attend, and be on time, to all practices, meetings, and rehearsals leading up to the date of the event. Teen participants are excused from Friday rehearsal due to school.
- Contestants agree to participate in all events of the pageant, including practices. Failure or refusal to participate may result in disqualification. Categories include interview, casual wear, and evening wear.
- Contestants will conduct themselves with dignity, grace, and good manners to the best of their ability.
- If contestants act unacceptably at any time during the pageant events, they may be disqualified.
- Contestants must agree the decisions of the Ms. Marvelous Judges are final.
